LETTER REGARDING PATENT TERM ADJUSTMENT PRINTED ON THE FRONT OF THE PATENT

The patent term adjustment printed on the above-identified patent, issued on March 22, 2016, does not correspond to the patent term adjustment determination in the USPTO's Patent Application Locating and Monitoring (PALM) system, which is displayed in PUBLIC PAIR. The value displayed in PAIR is one (1) to seven (7) days greater than the value printed on the front of the patent. However, because the Official patent term adjustment determination is the patent term adjustment printed on the front of the patent, patentee should consider requesting that the Office publish a certificate of correction under 35 USC 254 and 37 CFR 1.322 in the amount of the "PTA" that is displayed in PAIR.

If the patentee considers the "PTA" displayed in PAIR to be correct, patentee may request a certificate of correction to adjust the amount of "PTA" granted. The request must be filed within TWO (2) months from the mail date of this letter. No extensions of time under 37 CFR 1.136 will be available. There is no fee required for filing this request. The patentee should mail this letter along with the request for the Office to issue the certificate of correction. The request for a certificate of correction should be sent to the attention of the Office of Petitions and sent to Mail Stop: Petitions.

If patentee believes that the patent term adjustment printed on the above-identified patent should be an amount other than the patent term adjustment amount displayed in PAIR or printed on the front of the patent, patentee may file a Request for Reconsideration of the Patent Term Adjustment indicated on the patent under 37 CFR 1.705(d) within two months of the issuance of the patent or the available extensions of time under 37 CFR 1.136(a) along with the requisite fee; Alternatively, if patentee believes he is entitled to less "PTA" than was printed on the front of the patent, patentee may disclose the error in a letter to the Office that will be placed into the file without comment.
